1. Transport

- Play; spacebar
- Stop; spacebar
- Record; *command>spacebar*
- Play at half speed; *shift>spacebar*
- Quick punch; *shift* + *command>p*
- Loop playback; Shift>command + I
- Pre/post roll in/out; toggle command>k
- Auto input/input only monitoring; option (alt) >k

2. Editing

- Zoom in: *t* or *command>]*
- Zoom out; r or command>[
- Create edit point in clip; position cursor, then *command>e*
- Jump ahead to next edit point; tab
- Jump back to previous edit point; option (alt) >tab
- Delete clip after cursor: s
- Delete clip before cursor; a
- Tool selection including Smart Tool; toggle esc
- New track; *shift* +*command*>*n*
- Remove or delete clip; *shift* + *command>b*
- Consolidate several clips into one; *shift* + *command*>3

3. Importing and exporting files

- Import audio; *shift* + *command>i*
- Export audio; *shifty* +*command*>*k*
- Import video; shift + option(alt)+ command>i

4. Memory locators

- Set new memory location; position cursor, then *enter*
- Go to memory location; .>locator number on keypad>.
- Open memory location window; *command*>5
